When Willy Wonka describes Loompaland, he explains that it has 'thick jungles infested by the most dangerous beasts in the world - hornswogglers and snozzwangers and those terrible wicked whangdoodles.' Could you create a new creature from Loompaland? Could you add labels to show its different features?	Remind yourself about all the wonderful things that have been created in the world. Create a poster to encourage people to take care of their local environment. It must include advice on what changes they can make to do this.

Create a pizza divided into at least eight equal slices. They then create 3-5 different toppings and cover portions of the pizza with them to represent five fractions. Attach a key to show what fraction of the pizza each topping covers.	Charlie finds a 50p coin in the street. Find out what can be bought with just 50p. Explore how many fifty pence coins would be needed to buy certain items (e.g. a toothbrush, a magazine, a television).	Look at examples of 3 different boats eg. Canoes, speedboat, sailboat. Research: -What material they are made from? -Why this material has been chosen? -Who uses them and what for? How do they move across the water.
