<b>ENGLISH Activity 1</b>	<b>COMPUTING</b>	<b>SCIENCE</b>
Create a fact file about a nocturnal animal.  Make sure you include lots of detail, and illustrate it with a picture!	Use a search engine to research about a nocturnal animal. Find out about its appearance, diet, habitat and any special features of the animal!	Find some leaves and trees, conkers and anything you can safely collect outside. Do a detailed drawing of it in your book and label any parts you can identify.

Write a description of your local area. What types of wildlife can you see?  Use lots of adjectives and conjunctions to expand your sentences.	Using materials that are available to you, create a 3D model of a hedgehog or an owl.  	Create a bar chart, showing the number of different coloured cars you see on your way to school. (Or pick a road to observe traffic for 5 minutes!) Be creative in how you present your data!
<b>English Activity 3</b>	<b>RE</b>	<b>MATHS</b>
Create a road safety poster.  Remember to include a title, some information about road safety and a picture.	  Draw and describe a place that makes you feel safe and special. This could be a place of worship, your home or anywhere you feel cared for.	On your journey to school, make a list of all the different shapes you see (2D and 3D) and where you saw them.
