LEADERSHIP TEAM

Ms Reid, Campus Lead, is available each day. Our Senior Assistant Headteacher Mr Ermellino and Assistant Headteacher Mrs Gibbs will be available on the days they are not teaching.

Mrs. Harrison and Mrs. Wainwright (the Federation Executive Co-headteachers) will continue to share their time between Christ Church and the Peninsula and Woolwich campuses. Please ask in the office if you would like to speak to a specific person and Mrs Beaumont or Ms Layne can let them know.

NASAL FLU VACCINATION

Children from Reception to Year 6 will be receiving a letter regarding the nasal flu vaccination. Please read this letter carefully as it contains very important information. You must complete and return the consent form that comes with the letter even if you decide that you do not wish your child to receive the vaccination.

Please be reassured that your child will NOT receive this vaccination unless you have given permission.

THE START AND END OF THE SCHOOL DAY

In line with government guidelines and to ensure social distancing, the school day is structured differently. To minimise congestion by the gates, we ask that only one adult per family drops off or collects your child/children.

Beginning of the day procedures

Gates open for drop off between 8.40am and 9 am for pupils in Years 1- 6. Please try not to arrive too early as we cannot open the gate until 8.40am. Children can come at any time during this period. We are encouraging a staggered start to the day so that there are not too many parents arriving at the same time and social distancing can be observed.

For pupils in the Reception class, they are allowed to enter the playground from 9am-9.05am and line up with their teacher. If you arrive before 9am, then please can you ensure that you wait in a socially distanced space. To avoid crowding, once your child is in the playground, we do ask that you give them a final wave goodbye and then leave.

Thank you for your co-operation.

End of day procedures

Pupils should be collected promptly at the end of the day.

Reception-Between 2.55pm-3.00pm at the main gate Year 1 - 3.05 pm - At the main gate Year 2 - 3.05 pm - At the cage gate Year 3 - 3.15pm - At the main gate Year 4 - 3.15pm At the cage gate Year 5 & 6 - 3.15pm from the side gate on Blackwall Lane

All pupils line up and are dismissed from the playground. Parents are not allowed on the school premises at present. More detailed letters have been sent out about dismissal procedures. These are constantly under view.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

We would like to encourage 100% attendance and welcome your support with this. Children, who are not in school by 9am, miss out on the essential information that class teachers give their children, as well as the settling down time each morning. We will continue with our prize draw each half term for children with 100% attendance and punctuality. **ALL** pupils need to be collected promptly at the end of the school day.

SCHOOL DINNERS

School dinners are FREE to all children in year groups Reception, 1 and 2. Please take up this opportunity. Dinners are prepared and cooked fresh each day in our own kitchen.

If your child is in Year 3 - 6, then the cost of a school dinner is £2.75 a day. All dinners must be paid for in advance. School dinners cost £13.75 a week which is £96.25 each half term and £192.50 for the whole term.

Please help your child learn how to use their knife and fork correctly so they are able to eat their meal independently. We encourage good table manners and ask that parents help teach these too!

PACKED LUNCH

If your child brings a packed lunch to school, please ensure it is healthy and does not include nuts, sweets, chocolate or fizzy drinks. All packed lunch bags should be well labelled. At present, to minimise lunch bags being touched by several people, your child will keep their lunch box with them in the classroom rather than using the school fridges. If your child wishes to change from packed lunch to school dinners, please ensure you let the school office know. This is to ensure all children receive a meal.

SNACKS

Children in year groups Reception, 1 and 2 will be provided with a piece of fruit each day. Pupils in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 are permitted to bring in fruit for a snack at break time – no other food is allowed.

WATER BOTTLES

Please ensure that your child brings a water bottle to school each day.
