Dear Parents and Carers,

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome you to Reception at Christ Church Primary. I hope you have had a wonderful Summer break and are ready to embark on a whole new adventure with your child. My name is Miss Baptiste and I will be teaching your child along with the support of Mr. Southcott. We are looking forward to getting to know your child and working with you to support your child in achieving their full potential.

Our learning this term will be focusing on '**All About Me**' as well as '**Celebrations and Festivals**' after the October half term. These topics will enable us to discover the children's interests and how they learn best. We will be covering all areas of learning through our topics. In the first half of the term, we will be thinking about ourselves, who we are, what we can do and how we have changed. As the nights get longer, in the second half term, we will be thinking about light and celebrations in various religions. In RE we will be thinking about 'Why Jesus is special to Christians' and learning about different festivals.

Tapestry

In Reception, we use *Tapestry* to record and share your child's learning journey during their time in Nursery and Reception. This system allows staff to take photographs, videos, and write observations of the activities your child completes at school.

As parents and carers, you will have secure access to this information using your email address and password, so you can celebrate your child's achievements at home too. You should have already received an email to activate your account – please check your spam folder if it hasn't arrived. If you still haven't received it, please speak to your child's class teacher.

We also encourage you to share your child's learning experiences from home by uploading photos to *Tapestry*. These might include exciting activities or special moments at the weekend with family and friends. We will use these contributions during show and tell so children can celebrate their experiences with their classmates.

Communicating with teacher

As you can imagine, morning drop-off and home time are very busy for teachers, and we want to give our full attention to the children. This means we may not always be able to stop for a conversation each day. *Tapestry* has a messaging feature, which the class teacher can check and respond to as soon as possible. If your message is urgent, please speak to a teacher at the gate or contact the school office.

PE

PE lessons and physical development focus will take place on **Tuesdays every week**. It is essential that your child brings their full PE kit to school every Tuesday, starting from **23rd September**. Your child needs to come to school wearing their full school uniform as they will be getting changed for PE at school. The PE kit needs to contain a white T-shirt, black/dark shorts, jogging bottoms as well as trainers or plimsolls and a tracksuit top. Please ensure all clothes are clearly labelled including the shoes. Please also note that for your own child's welfare, hooped earrings are not to be worn. Only studs are allowed as stated in the school prospectus.

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Homework & Phonics

In Reception, there is a strong focus on phonics and supporting your child in learning to read. We follow the *Little Wandle* programme, introducing new sounds each week that your child will gradually use to read words. Your child will receive a homework book, and each Friday they will be given phonics homework to complete. This will recap what has been taught in school that week and help consolidate their learning at home. Please return the homework book the following Friday, when it will be checked and a new task provided.

On the homework sheet, you will find a link to the *Little Wandle* parents' information page, which contains further guidance on supporting your child with phonics. We have also provided an information sheet with advice on how to pronounce the sounds correctly and helpful phrases to support letter formation.

Reading books

A teacher will change the children's reading books once a week, every Wednesday. Each week, your child will also bring home a pleasure book for you to share together. From Week 4 (29th September), they will also receive a phonics book that matches the sounds they are learning in school.

In class, your child will collect a tick on their reading bookmark for every book they read. Once they have collected 12 ticks, they will be awarded a special reading certificate during collective worship.

We recommend that you listen to your child read at least three times a week, as this will greatly support their reading and writing development. Each time you read with your child, please remember to sign their reading record. If a record is not signed, we will assume that the book has not been read.

If a reading record is lost, there will be a replacement cost of £1. Lost or damaged school reading books will incur a replacement cost of £6.

Pick up and drop off

Please encourage your child to be independent by walking into class on their own from the Reception gate. We are teaching them important routines, such as hanging up their coat and bag by themselves and sitting on the carpet ready for learning. Your support with this will help them build confidence and independence – thank you!

If you have any queries or concerns, please come and speak to us or make an appointment at the office if you wish to have a longer or more private discussion. I look forward to your support while working with your child and helping them get the most from their first term in school.
