Reading

- Children's books will be changed weekly there is a sign with your child's day on the playground door (which you can see at pick up)
- Each child has spent time with an adult in class to decide their reading level.
 - In addition to reading their school reading book, please do feel encourage reading of other books at

home

- Read at home every day record in reading records
 - Discussing the text
 - Explore new vocabulary
 - Asking questions e.g.
 - Where is the story set? How do you know?
 - What was your favourite part of the book? Why?
 - Can you find any adjectives?

e.g. "Enzo read well with dad and answered some questions about the story."

Homework

- Homework is available on Satchel and in the children's homework books in the form of a menu, with multiple options to complete. Try to complete at least 4 tasks per half-term and upload any completed work onto Satchel.
- If you are having trouble logging into Satchel, please let your teacher know

KS1 SATs

- Opportunity for the government to look at pupils nationally to ensure that schools are helping their pupils to make progress in English and Mathematics.
- They also help teachers identify pupils who may need additional support and make sure this is put in place as early as possible.
- The assessments will take place throughout May, however we will do various assessment weeks throughout the school year.
- Some examples of the tests your child will be taking are available to look at closer to the time

Please do not feel worried about these tests

- The children will be taken out in small groups
- They will not be put under a time pressure
- The environment and atmosphere of the tests will be very relaxed
- We do not want the children worry about these assessments



Marking- we give feedback in a variety of ways including marking, whole class feedback, peer marking
