



In the Koinonia Federation we strive for excellence and high standards through:



A Koinonia student will go out into the world happy, courageous, resilient, motivated with a lifelong love of learning, fully equipped to make a positive contribution to society.

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Aims

This policy aims to:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for school uniform

Our school's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

The [Equality Act 2010](#) prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include sex, race, religion or belief, and gender reassignment.

To avoid discrimination, our school will:

- Avoid listing uniform items based on sex, to give all students the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in or that most reflects their self-identified gender
- Make sure that our uniform costs the same for all students
- Allow all students to have long hair (though we reserve the right to ask for this to be tied back)
- Allow all student to style their hair in the way that is appropriate for school yet makes them feel most comfortable
- Allow students to request changes to swimwear for religious reasons
- Allow students to wear headscarves and other religious or cultural symbols
- Allow for adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by asking students or their parents to get in touch

Limiting the cost of school uniform

Our Federation has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory [guidance](#) from the Department for Education on the cost of school uniform. We understand that items with distinctive characteristics (such as branded items, or items that have to have a school logo or a unique fabric/colour/design) cannot be purchased from a wide range of retailers and that requiring many such items limits parents' ability to 'shop around' for a low price. We will make sure our uniform:

- Is available at a reasonable cost
- Provides the best value for money for parents/carers

We will do this by:

- Carefully considering whether any items with distinctive characteristics are necessary, limiting any items with distinctive characteristics where possible. For example, only the school jumper/cardigan or blazer, worn over the shirt, has to feature the school logo.
- Limiting items with distinctive characteristics to low-cost or long-lasting items, such as ties.
- Avoiding specific requirements for items pupils could wear on non-school days, such as coats, bags and shoes
- Keeping the number of optional branded items to a minimum, so that the school's uniform can act as a social leveler
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for different Year groups
- Making sure that arrangements are in place for parents to acquire second-hand uniform items
- Avoiding frequent changes to uniform specifications and minimising the financial impact on parents of any changes

Expectations for school uniform

The Koinonia Federation uniform is as follows:

Primary Phases

Christ Church

Girls	Grey skirt or trousers or pinafore dress, blue or white polo shirt, royal blue sweatshirt, jumper, cardigan, blue fleece
Boys	Grey trousers, blue or white polo shirt, royal blue sweatshirt, jumper, cardigan or fleece
Footwear	Safe, flat sensible shoes or trainers – black in colour
Jewellery	Small studs and a wrist watch if your child can tell the time

In the summer boys are allowed to wear grey school shorts and girls are allowed to wear blue checked dresses

St Mary Magdalene (Peninsula and Woolwich)

Girls	Grey skirt or trousers or pinafore dress, dark yellow polo shirt, burgundy sweatshirt and/or a dark grey fleece
Boys	Grey trousers, dark yellow polo shirt, burgundy sweatshirt and/or a dark grey fleece
Footwear	Safe, flat sensible shoes or trainers – black in colour
Jewellery	Small studs and a wrist watch if your child can tell the time

In the summer boys are allowed to wear grey school shorts and girls are allowed to wear red checked dresses

Secondary Phase

UNIFORM (ALL STUDENTS)

Blazer	Blazer from school supplier only
Trousers	Formal trousers, mid-dark grey, no fashion trousers
White shirt	Plain, long sleeved school shirt, stiff collar, no designer features
School tie	School tie from school supplier only
School jumper	School jumper from school supplier only
Grey socks	Plain
Black shoes	Plain, black, flat polishable school shoes (below the ankle)

UNIFORM (GIRLS)

Kilt	St Mary Magdalene tartan kilt from school supplier (kilt length must be below the knee).
Grey tights or plain grey socks	Tights must be at least 40 denier
Head covering (optional)	Plain, mid-dark grey (no fashion scarves)
School tie	School tie from school supplier only
Outdoor coat	Plain black, grey or navy; single colour with no designer features
Bag	A large bag (to carry A4 books and equipment)

P.E. KIT

PE Rugby shirt and/or polo shirt	From school supplier only
Black shorts	From school supplier or another retailer
Tracksuit bottoms	From school supplier or another retailer
Black socks	From school supplier or another retailer
Trainers	Suitable for all sports on all surfaces

JEWELLERY & MAKE UP

Students may wear:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A wrist watch• One pair of stud earrings in their ears

<i>No make up should be worn</i>
