Bishop Karowei Visit

How often do you get the opportunity to interview a Bishop? The pupils and students of St Mary Magdalene, Peninsula Campus recently had the opportunity to do just that.

During a busy morning on 25th April, Bishop Karowei – Bishop of Woolwich - joined staff and students in the Peninsula School campus for an inspiring and engaging time of discussion and sharing. He started the day by leading our Primary phase in Collective Worship, followed by meeting with a selection of students from all year groups up to and including our Year 13 Sixth Form students. He met with our Secondary Pupil Faith Team who asked, among other things, about his journey to becoming a Bishop and whether he thought his past career and skills were now being wasted. The Primary Pupil Faith Team spent some time asking him questions including a rather interesting question about free will, choice and God knowing our destiny.





Finally, the Bishop spent time with a selection of our Sixth Form students from Year 12 and 13. They asked for words of wisdom about the journey of life and what his favourite Bible passage was at the moment. He spoke deeply about his faith – through life's toughest time s of loss and grief, through times of celebration and through watching others going seasons through hard situations. He spoke of the words in John 3:16 and God's love for each and every one us and that God's love means that we have no reason to perish or be lost forever. Our students asked fascinating questions about faith and strength, about scripture and theology. I wonder what you would have asked if you had been in the room. The Bishop then prayed with each group and left them with some words of wisdom and God's blessing.

Brilliant Club 2023

The launch trip to Goldsmiths College, London University





This year has been an exciting year for the Brilliant Club pupils at both Saint Mary Magdalene and Christ Church. Following on from the Covid lockdowns, the Scholars Programme recommenced the Brilliant Club for a group of selected pupils to undergo University Style learning with PhD tutor. Unfortunately, due to the rules of Covid, the launch trips, tutorials and graduations were all undertaken virtually. This year, we have been very fortunate in that all elements of the Scholars Programme are no longer run remotely. This included our university launch trip, which is the initial part of the programme and involves our Brilliant Club pupils visiting one of the Russell Group universities to find out what life and learning are like there.

Having selected 14 pupils, 6 from our Woolwich Campus, 5 from our Peninsula Campus and 3 from Christ Church, we undertook our Launch visit. Overall, the day was a real success and our pupils behaved extremely well, being excellent ambassadors for our Federation. Our project for this academic year is all about the Heart which will be taught by our PhD tutor; Randy Chance. Brilliant Club pupils are now looking forward to participating in their tutorials and studying hard with their assignments and science investigations over the next few weeks.



School Facillities for Hire

The Koinonia Federation has state of the art facilities to hire at St Mary Magdalene, Peninsula Campus consisting of a multi-use sports hall for games such as basketball, tennis, badminton and football. The school has a 4G Astro floodlit football pitch and two outdoor multi-use games areas, changing room accommodation serves both indoor and outdoor sports activities. Internally the school boasts a well-equipped main hall with projector and sound facilities along with dram and dance studios. For a more educational hiring experience, the school offers a 100 seat capacity lecture theatre or whiteboard equipped studio classroom.

The Federation also hires out facilities at St Mary Magdalene, Woolwich Campus and Christ Church School with a range of facilities including a sports hall, roof terrace, ball court, classrooms, outside multi-use games area and large capacity hall space. These facilities are heavily used, both by the school and the local community.


