Evolving Over Time Topic

The first part of the trip involved a guided tour of Greenwich with historian Rick Jones, where they learnt about the history and power of significant buildings such as The Queen's House. Next, they travelled by Uber Boat to Canary Wharf, London's financial district, to observe and draw buildings that represent a newer financial power in our history. The drawings and photographs taken on the day will later be used to develop their sketchbook in class as well as ideas for their final outcomes.

The film is full of references to the Belle Epoque, a chefd'oeuvre of colour, humour, and political finesse, with a delicate touch of feminism.


