CELEBRATING OUR 1ST EVER 'A' LEVEL & BTEC RESULTS

We are very proud of the Year 13 students who left us at the end of the summer term. On Thursday 17th August they collected their 'A' level and BTEC results and there was lots to celebrate. We are extremely proud of their outcomes and delighted to share that 50% of our students were offered their first choice of university with another 25% being offered their second choice.

Across our 2023 cohort we have many individuals achieving some great results, enabling them to gain entry to some top universities including St Andrew's, UCL and Bristol. Subjects our students will study at university are wide ranging including Law, Medicine, Mathematics, Business Management, Psychology, Politics, Urban Planning, Criminology, Biological Science, Film and Television Production... and the list goes on.

Our top 3 performers who all achieved A, A, B this year are... Favour – now studying Law at University of Leicester Amy-Ellen – now studying Psychology at University of Bristol Paulina – now studying History at UCL (University College London)

ST MARY MAGDALENE SECONDARY PHASE CELEBRATES EXCELLENT RESULTS FOR ITS FIRST A LEVEL AND BTEC COHORT

Our staff team have been congratulating our Year 13 students as they received their A Level and BTEC results. In what has been a challenging few years for young people across the country, the excellent accomplishments of our students are a testimony to their hard work and the dedication of their teachers. Many students have surpassed their own expectations; many have also triumphed in the face of enormous difficulties. We are extremely proud of all our Sixth Form leavers.

We are delighted to see that, based on our Fisher Family Trust (FFT) benchmarks, our students achieved half a grade higher than students of a similar starting point in the country.

Over seventy-five percent of our students have been accepted onto their choices of university and course, including many Russell Group Universities such as UCL and St. Andrews. In total, ninety-seven percent of students have secured a suitable higher education pathway this summer.

Subject areas of particular merit include social sciences achieving a one-hundred percent pass rate (including several A*s) and BTEC Sport students achieving one-hundred percent Distinction.

Whatever our students' results, we know their determination and persistence have helped them achieve these outcomes. We are proud of their efforts and look forward to hearing all about their further education experiences.

I would also like to thank the St. Mary Magdalene staff team for working so hard in supporting our students in meeting their potential.

KEY STAGE 4 RESULTS 2023

We are delighted to share our GCSE results this year which have improved on last year's results. Many of our students achieved high grades enabling them to move into Sixth Form to study A levels or BTECs. Our GCSE English results are particularly noteworthy with 74% of our cohort achieving a strong pass (5+) this is 19% higher than this year's national average! Our Mathematics results grade5+ is also is above national average.

Principal's Press Statement

Our class of 2023 have been celebrating our wonderful results today. A huge congratulations to all of our students on their hard work and accomplishments, no matter what grade they are awarded; the excellent accomplishments of St Mary Magdalene students are testimony to their hard work, and the dedication and support of their teachers.

Grades at 4 and 5 in English and Maths have significantly increased, crucial for future study, with 74% of our students achieving a grade 5 or above in English. The achievements of our students are significant given the level of disruption they have experience over the years and even within their final year of education in year 11. Our results match up favourably with those of the local authority pre-pandemic.

A huge congratulations to our staff team. Not only through the daily timetabled lessons, but all the additional sessions they led before and after school, as well as weekend and half term sessions. I know our students are truly grateful and from a staff perspective, witnessing the joy in our students today. I can say that all the effort was truly worth it. It was also pleasing to see a number of students also have met the grades they needed to meet their entry requirements for the next phase of their education.

PRIMARY RESULTS 2023

In the primary phase we have lots of good news to celebrate from our Early Years assessments right through to Key Stage 2 SATs.

Our Reception pupils of 2023 have above national and local average attainment across all areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

At Christ Church 75% of the cohort achieved a good level of development and across both St Mary Magdalene the figure was 77% (the national level was 67%).

Our Key Stage 1 assessments and Key Stage 2 SATs tests follow the same pattern with the number of pupils reaching the expected standard being either in line or above the national percentages.

It is reassuring to know our primary provision is providing a solid foundation for our pupils so they are ready to take their next steps into secondary education.
