Christ Church School were inspected by Ofsted on 10th and 11th November 2021. We have once again been deemed a good school and we are delighted with the result.

This was our first inspection under the new framework and the process will support us in our work across the Federation as well as with preparations for St. Mary Magdalene's next inspection.

'Pupils spoke with joy and enthusiasm about their life at school. They love to talk about their learning and are proud of their achievements. Pupils behave well and are friendly and welcoming. They enjoy being part of the Christ Church community and get on well together.'

'Leaders and staff have high expectations of themselves and of pupils. Staff make sure that pupils do well across all subjects. They keep a watchful eye on pupils' individual needs and give pupils extra help when they need it.'

This term Year 5 are studying extreme environments with a focus on the polar regions. They have created explanation texts to help any young explorer!


