
#### St Mary Magdalene, Woolwich - Year 4 Fonteyn

## Sixth Form

#### Careers

Year 12 have been focusing on Careers through their Friday Family Group sessions, they have looked at things such as: planning for post-18; individual interests; using Unifrog; application processes; and CV writing.

For those budding doctors, we have agreed to partner with Greenwich Health Ambassadors who will provide 1-2-1 mentoring for year 12s and 13s that desire to enter the field of medicine post-18. We are really looking forward to being paired with our NHS practitioner, who works and practices medicine in Greenwich borough, whilst providing voluntary support to our students.

In January we will begin our year 12 careers interviews with an external careers advisor. These are valuable sessions which allow pupils to start planning their next steps. Each student will have a thirty-minute 1-2-1 meeting.

#### **UCAS Applications:**

Looking to build on the success of last year, with 80% of our students going on to places at a higher education institution, we continue to support our students with the application process. At the time of writing, we are approaching half of the applications being sent off, well in time of our internal deadline of the Christmas holidays. Almost all of these students have received at least one offer of a place, with several students achieving five offers at this early date. Some notable success so far include; a student being awarded a place at the prestigious London Met Film School; several students being offered places at Russell Group institutions; places to study Law and also International Relations at Warwick; two students being offered places at SOAS, including one for Law and one student securing a place on a course in accounting which includes a year placement at PWC. The process will continue well into December and we look forward to more success.

#### Reflection Week

For this term's reflection week, we followed the theme of Humanism and the exploration of other worldviews. This was a great opportunity for a lot of students who weren't familiar with the idea of Humanism and its rising popularity in the UK, and it allowed them to inquire into themes such as morality and practices.

This month, we had a speaker from the Humanist Society come in and speak about their experience as an ex-Christian. The students were very welcoming and really engaged with the talk - asking questions about personal exploration and whether or not they felt they have to explain their beliefs to a lot of people. Overall, the reflection week's success was highlighted by the fact all students walked away with a greater understanding of Humanism and how other worldviews fit into society



#### 6<sup>th</sup> Form Open Evening

On Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> November, we held our open evening, hosting parents and Year 11 students from across the borough of Greenwich and Bexley. On the evening we had over 100 visitors who all experienced a sample of 6<sup>th</sup> Form life with taster sessions in each subject area as well as a talk from the 6<sup>th</sup> Form team. The feedback we received at the event was positive and we look forward to the start of the next enrolment process to help our community grow.
