Dear Parents/Carers

We hope you have managed to spend some time together as a family during the Easter break. The weather has been very different from our usual British bank holiday weather and we hope you have been able to make the most of the sunshine whilst staying safe and you have managed to enjoy a walk at some point.

It is certainly a start to the Summer Term that none of us could have foreseen but, in our new 'remote' fashion, we welcome each and everyone of you to the Summer Term. Our memory verse for this term is: *Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; His love endures forever Psalms 107:1*

The last two weeks of the Spring Term certainly brought challenges for all of us and we have all had to adapt to new ways of working so we would like to begin this term by saying a huge 'thank you' to all of you – 'thank you' for finding your way through this new way of home- school working together and for doing your very best to support your child's learning.

The latest extension to the current guidelines came at the end of last week with the decision to extend the current restrictions by a further three weeks. This means that schools will not reopen to all children until at least Monday 11th May and possibly far further into the future. We continue to provide a service for critical workers who have no way of keeping their children at home and we also continue to offer spaces to some other children where their needs cannot be met at home or there are other specific reasons for children to be in school.

Provision for school places for essential workers and other identified children: If you have not yet used the school provision but your child is eligible to attend, i.e. has no way of remaining at home and has a. a parent who is an key/essential worker and cannot work from home, b. has an EHCP and their needs cannot be met at home, or c. has an allocated social worker, please do contact eholliday@koinoniafederation.com if you now feel that they need to attend. We will remind all parents that the Government advice remains that, wherever possible, children should remain at home. If your children usually attends one of our Nursery classes and you are an essential worker who cannot keep your child at home, then please also email and make a request for Nursery provision. Those children who are in school are taking part in a range of educational activities which are not the same as the virtual learning tasks, however both children at home and school are given the opportunities to develop a range of knowledge and skills appropriate for their age at this unusual time for schooling.

We are conscious that some of you may be finding this time financially challenging. We hope that all of you who are eligible for Free School Meals have signed up to receive the weekly monetary vouchers for a range of supermarkets. More details can be found on previous letters which are on our website www.koininafederation.com We are also able to share with you details of the *Community Hub Support for Families*. Please do contact them if you need support.

Greenwich Community Hub Support for Families: The Greenwich Community Hub can provide support for a range of challenges families face whether that is financial pressures or otherwise. This includes:

- collecting / delivering prescriptions
- delivering essential food packages
- connecting families to local community services to support with other areas such as finances
