Reading challenge: The Summer Reading Challenge, presented by The Reading Agency, is delivered in partnership with public libraries and funded by Arts Council England. The Challenge encourages children aged 4 to 11 to enjoy the benefits of reading for pleasure over the summer holidays, providing lots of fun as well as helping to prevent the summer reading 'dip'. This year's Summer Reading Challenge theme is Gadgeteers, created in partnership with Science Museum Group and illustrated by top children's writer and illustrator Julian Beresford. This year's theme 'Gadgeteers' will spark children's curiosity about the world around them. With resources and activities from the Science Museum Group, the Challenge focuses on inspiring children to see the science and innovation behind everyday objects, showing that reading and science are for everyone.

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Personalised Learning Plans

If your child/ children has/have been receiving additional support in class- more than interventions which are included in Quality First Teaching- they will have had a Personalised Learning Plan (PLP) written this year.

Personalised Learning Plans lay out the additional support that your child/ children are receiving as well as targets that have been set to help them to make progress in the necessary areas of learning.

The progress made by your child/children have made this academic year towards these targets will be laid out in a summer term Personalised Learning Plan. These Personalised Learning Plans will be included alongside your child's report.

If your child/children continue/s to require additional support next academic year, their Personalised Learning Plan will be updated in the autumn term and new short-term targets will be set. There may also be an update to the intervention and support that your child is receiving to help them to achieve the outcomes on their plan.

Speech and Language support at St Mary Magdalene

At St Mary Magdalene we commission the Oxleas NHS Speech and Language Therapy Team to work in our schools.

An Oxleas Speech and Language Therapist is at each campus for either half a day each week or a full day every two weeks.

The role of the Speech and Language Therapist is to train staff to support specific speech and language needs as well as assessing and reviewing the specific needs of individual children. Our linked Speech and Language Therapists always work closely with other services such as the Educational Psychologist and the ASD outreach team so that all of a child's needs are considered when plans are written.

The Speech and Language team will see a child on their caseload a number of times each academic year. The targets and interventions that they set are delivered by trained members of the staff team. Mrs Kelly also receives all of the Speech and Language training so that she is able to train new members of staff immediately.
