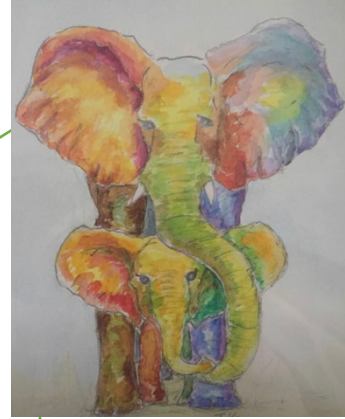




This is a picture drawn and painted by my son and daughter-in-law. It was given to me as a gift because I love elephants and the colours represent love, happiness and hope.
