Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you had a peaceful break and had the opportunity to make some special family memories together over the summer. A very warm welcome back to academic year 2025-26. We have a very enriched term ahead and look forward to the children having many exciting opportunities. Please spare a few moments to read the newsletter each half term, and regularly check your emails as they contain lots of important information. Over the next few weeks, you will get to meet the teachers, some that you already know and some who are new to the federation. This is a great opportunity to get to know each other more, and begin working together to support your child to be a flourishing, successful learner.

Over the first couple of weeks, the children have been getting to know their adults, and new friends who have joined our federation family. It's heartwarming to see how the everyone has been welcoming to the new members of our family. Last week, all classes took part in an exciting art project and spent time getting to know each other better, and created some fantastic pieces of art. They learnt about an artist, explored the artist's art and responded to the art by creating art of their own. I have enjoyed seeing the classes working and seeing a real buzz of learning from the children and staff. Please join me in thanking Ms Gibbs for creating this exciting start to the year!







Well done to all the new children in the Reception classes for transitioning so smoothly into the Reception class. They have all settled in well and are adapting excellently to the new routines and expectations of Reception. This week the children will be coming into the reception playground areas on their own, and you will be saying good bye to them from the wooden gate. Thank you for working with us on building this routine with the children, and supporting their independence.

Our first collective worship of the year focused on our federation values, the termly theme, our value and how we can support others to build **resilience** and **flourish**. We were proud to start off the year reminding the children about our dedicated group of Mental Health Champions who help our school community to be happy and feel supported. If you would like more information on what the team does, please speak with Ms Amao.

**Punctuality**: Please may we remind you of the importance of children being on time and settled in their classrooms before the start of the school day. Your child may go straight to class once their playground gates are opened at 8:40 am; class registers are taken at 8:55 am when the playground gates are locked. Children arriving after the gates are locked should go directly to school office to be signed in. Arrivals after 8:55 am are marked as late. The first 10–15 minutes of the morning are used for revisiting key skills such as handwriting, spelling, reading, times tables and arithmetic, which children start before the registers are taken.

**Attendance**: We believe every school day is a chance for children to grow their skills, build connections and pave the way for a flourishing future. Regular attendance is very important to our school family, please be reminded of the importance of fellowship and being part of our school family each day. We will continue to have high expectations as we go through the year, and again thank you for working with us to support your children in looking smart, and being prepared for the school day. Please continue to ensure that your children are wearing the correct uniform – there is more information on what this looks like in the pages below.

**Class Newsletter:** Teachers are busy completing these and aim to have them to you by the Friday of the second week back each term. These will include information about the topic and subject areas your child will be learning about each half term. It will also have important, class specific dates and helpful reminders such as PE dates and upcoming trips. These will also be emailed to you.

**Communication**: Staff are always on hand at the playground gates, should you need to speak to them. This can be tricky on a morning as things are very busy but you are very welcome to speak to staff after school. If your enquiry is urgent you can speak to a member of the office team to make an appointment for a meeting or phone call with your child's class teacher or another member of staff.

# For any new parents or a reminder to existing parents:

- We ask that you drop your children off at the gates on a morning to support us in developing the children's independence and confidence.
- Before and after school care must be booked the week prior. This ensures we have the right number of staff, food, and equipment in place.
- All dietary requirements, allergies and religious sensitives will be respectfully observed and catered for by our kitchen staff. Please tell a member of the office team if your child has any dietry requirements, and we ask that you keep us updated of any changes.
- Medical Appointment Reminder: To ensure the safety of all children, evidence of medical appointments
  must be shown to the office team prior to the appointment. Without this, we will not be able to authorise
  vour child's absence.
- Please continue to notify the school **each** consecutive day your child is absent due to illness. Your cooperation helps us keep accurate attendance registers and support your child's health wellbeing.
- Please do not park on the double lines nearthe school. We don't want you getting a parking ticket and want to keep the road clear to ensure that the zebra crossings can be used safely.

As we move forward into the term, please keep an eye on your emails for upcoming events and information. We encourage you to stay involved, as your participation makes a real difference to our children's education and their overall school experience.

Guard and guide each parent and family as they navigate this new school year and bless each child as they seek to learn all that they can.



# **Wet Home time Dismissal Arrangements**

Wet dismissal can be a very hectic time. please be patient with the staff, and do not come into the building and wait for your child to be called to you at the door.

- ▶ Reception class Orchard and Bellamy classes will be dismissed as normal.
- ➤ Year 1 Stephens Class will be dismissed from the double doors by the main staircase. This is further along from the Reception Classes, Studio and toilets.
- ► Year 2 Ipgrave class will be dismissed from the outdoor Nursery area.
- ➤ Year 3 Sanders and Jerwood classes, will be dismissed from the door (closest to the Nursery) leading to the staircase. 1st door along the side of the building.
- ➤ Year 4 Elliott and Palmer classes will be dismissed from the first door (closest to the nursery) in the main hall. 2<sup>nd</sup> door along the side of the building.
- ➤ Year 5 Talbot and Powell will be dismissed from the second door (furthest from the nursery) in the main hall. 3<sup>rd</sup> door along the side of the building.
- ➤ Year 6 Eastaugh and Gregory classes will be dismissed from the second door (furthest from the nursery) in the main hall. 3<sup>rd</sup> door along the side of the building.

# **Useful Information and Expectations**

I ask that when we are communicating, especially at times when we are unhappy, we all remember our mission and consider 'DO UNTO OTHERS, AS YOU WOULD HAVE THEM DO UNTO YOU' Luke 6:13, and treat everyone with the respect, politeness, compassion and understanding.

#### Uniform

#### We are continuing to look smart around the school.

If your child feels cold, please do not send them to school wearing a skin (tight clothing under a shirt) but ensure they are wearing the school jumper or cardigan. Whilst we are wearing dark-coloured bottoms and jumpers for PE, they must be regular jumpers and bottoms, not sports wear. If children are not wearing the correct PE uniform, they may be asked to wear school PE uniforms. Parents will be called to discuss this.

# Children will continue to come to school on their PE lesson day in their PE kit;

- Plain white t- shirt
- dark-coloured shorts / bottoms
- dark-coloured jumper or cardigan
- black trainers/plimsolls for PE.

# Children should NOT be wearing as PE uniform;

- a hoodie
- skins/base layers under the white T-shirt
- football shirts
- sporty track suit with labels





When the children are on the campus, hoods should be down unless it is raining. This looks smarter, and we thank you again for supporting us with this.

To keep the children safe, only small studs (**no hooped earrings**) and a wrist watch is permitted. Other jewellery will be removed.

#### Allergies

We have multiple children and staff members with nut allergies, of which some are airborne and extremely dangerous.

# Please do not send your child into school with;

- Any nuts
- Nutella or other chocolate spread containing nuts
- Peanut butter
- Snacks/ cereal bars containing nuts

Always check the ingredients of any food you are sending into school – class party food, gifts for staff, packed lunches or anything else to be certain that they do NOT contain nuts. Sometimes they are not obvious! We thank you all for your cooperation and support with keeping out school family safe.



# **Useful Information and Expectations**



#### Organised and Prepared

Please make make sure that your child has everything that they need when they arrive at school. If you are dropping forgotten items off in the office, they will be delivered to you child's class at break or lunch time as we do not want to disturb the learning time.

#### The start and end of the school Day

Pupils should be collected promptly at the end of the day at 3.10 pm. Please ensure your child's pick-up arrangements are communicated with the school.

Reception pupils are dismissed from the classroom and all other years are dismissed from the MUGA pitch.

#### **School Lunch**

School dinners are FREE to all children in school. Please take up this opportunity. Dinners are prepared and cooked fresh each day in our own kitchen. If your child brings a packed lunch to school, please ensure it is healthy and does not include nuts, sweets, chocolate or fizzy drinks. All packed lunch bags should be well labelled. If your child wishes to change from packed lunch to school dinners, please ensure you let the school office know. This is to ensure all children receive a meal, and we reduce the amount of wasted food.

#### Snacks

Children in year groups Reception, 1 and 2 are provided with a piece of fruit each day. Pupils in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 are permitted to bring in fruit for a snack at break time – no other food is allowed, **especially nuts**, we are a **NO NUT school**.

#### **Allergies**

We have multiple children and staff members with nut allergies allergies and are extremely dangerous. You will have received but we will continue to remind you about this allergy to ensure community are safe.

#### **Uniform**

#### PLEASE ENSURE ALL CLOTHES ARE CLEARLY LABELLED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME.

Lost property will be given to charity at the end of each term!

Children will continue to come to school on their PE lesson day in their school uniform - white t-shirts, dark-coloured shorts / bottoms, black jumper or cardigan (**no hoodies**, **skins or football shirts**) and black trainers/plimsolls for PE. Hoods should be down when the children enter the campus, unless it is raining.

Please ensure that your child is wearing the correct uniform, including their PE uniform. Children should not be wearing a skin under their polo shirts, if they get cold, they need to wear a unifom jumper or cardigan. If children are not wearing the correct uniform, they may be asked to remove it and may be provided with school uniform. Shoes and trainers should be black, with no colours or symbols on them.

Small studs (**no hooped earrings**) and a wrist watch if your child can tell the time. Other jewellery will be removed.

#### Pencil Cases and Other Items From Home

#### **Water Bottles**

Please ensure that your child brings a water bottle to school each day – no glass. It needs to be clearly labelled with your child's name.

#### **Photos**

Please do not take photos of other children in school. Photos of your child taking part in collective worships, singining etc, should not be put on social media.

#### **Party Bags**

We will not be distributing party bags or birthday cake to celebrate birthdays. If your child has a birthday and you are looking to provide the class with a treat, why not buy a book for the class - inscribed with their name!

# Safeguarding
