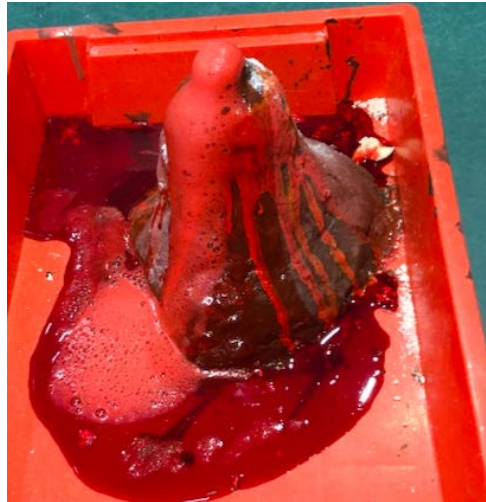


Turner Class have been reading The Gingerbread Man this week. They have been making their own gingerbread people at home and in school using different materials. Here are some pictures of their creations.

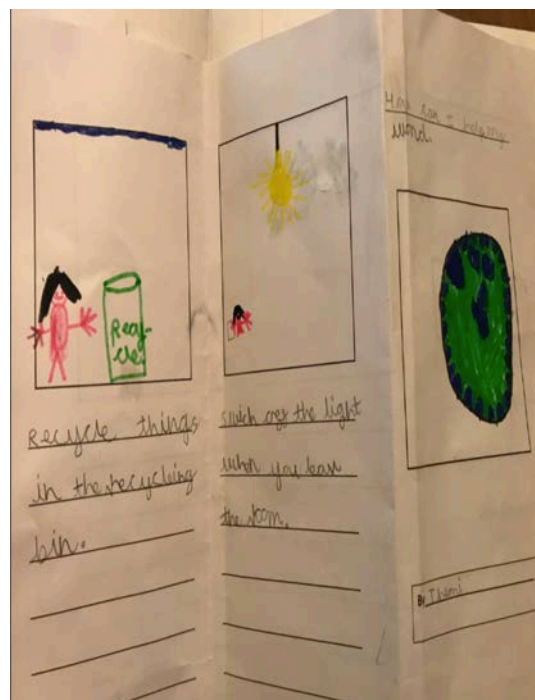
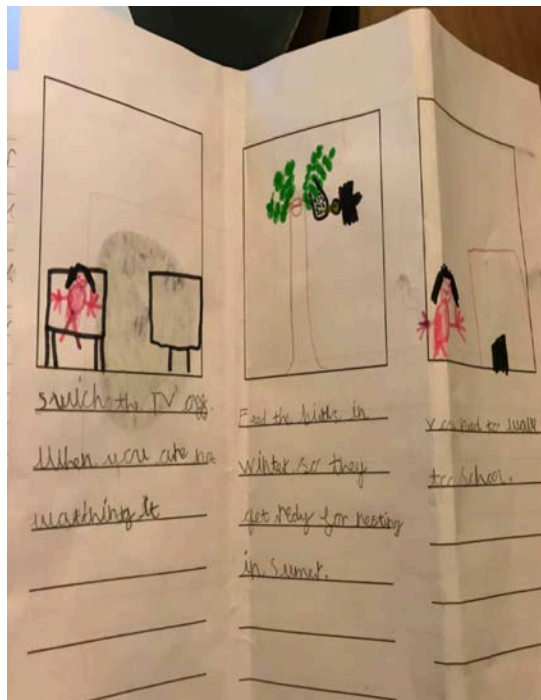
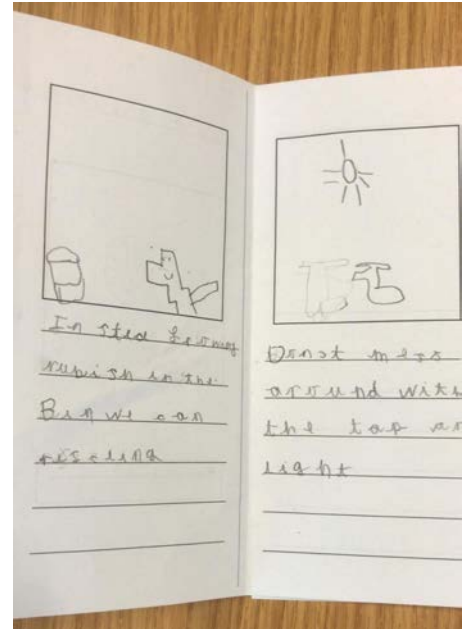
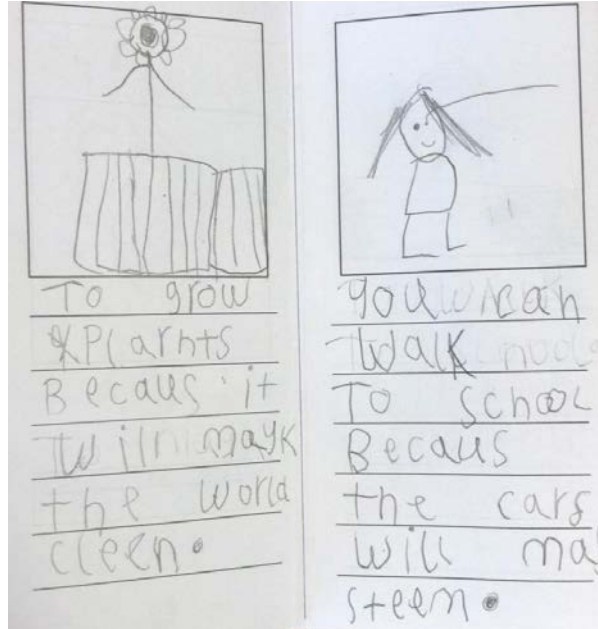


Reception pupils went on a phonics hunt at home and in school to find lots of things that begun with the **d** sound.





Pupils in **Stephens and Sideman** classes, have been busy making leaflets on how we can look after our world. Below is some of the lovely work done at home and in school.



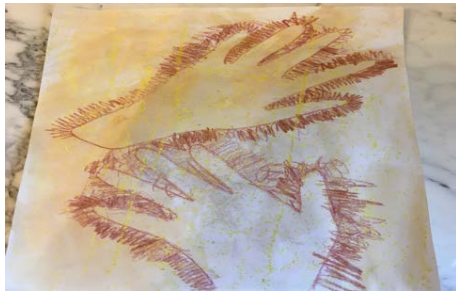

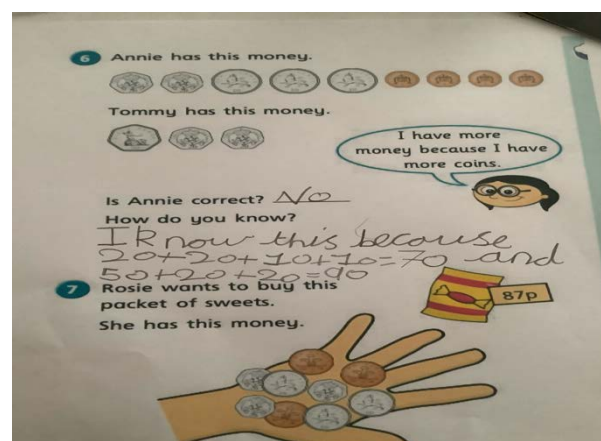
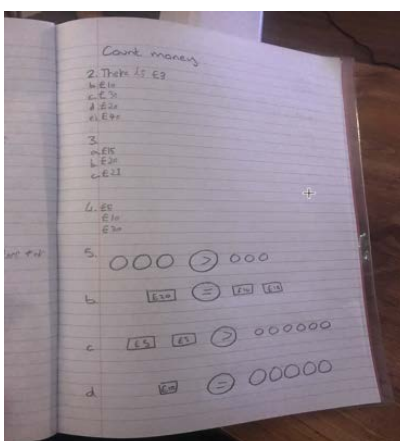
Sanders Class have been learning more about The Stone Ages.

What creature do you think this is?

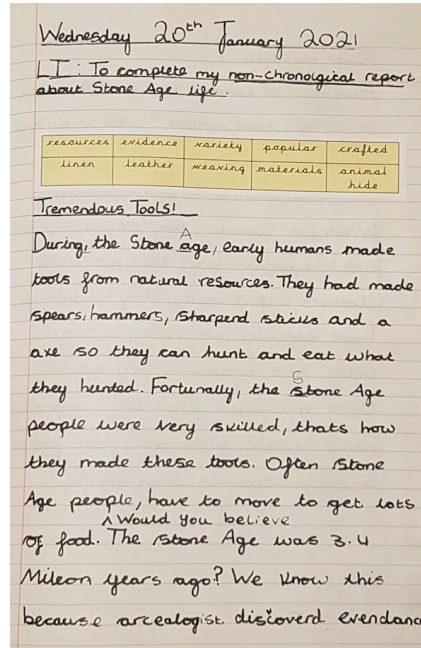
In Maths we have been learning about money.



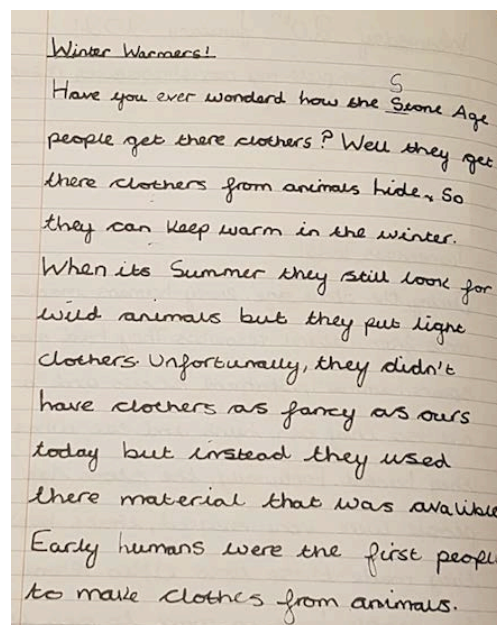


The **Year 3 and 4 bubble** this week, have also been learning about the stone age.

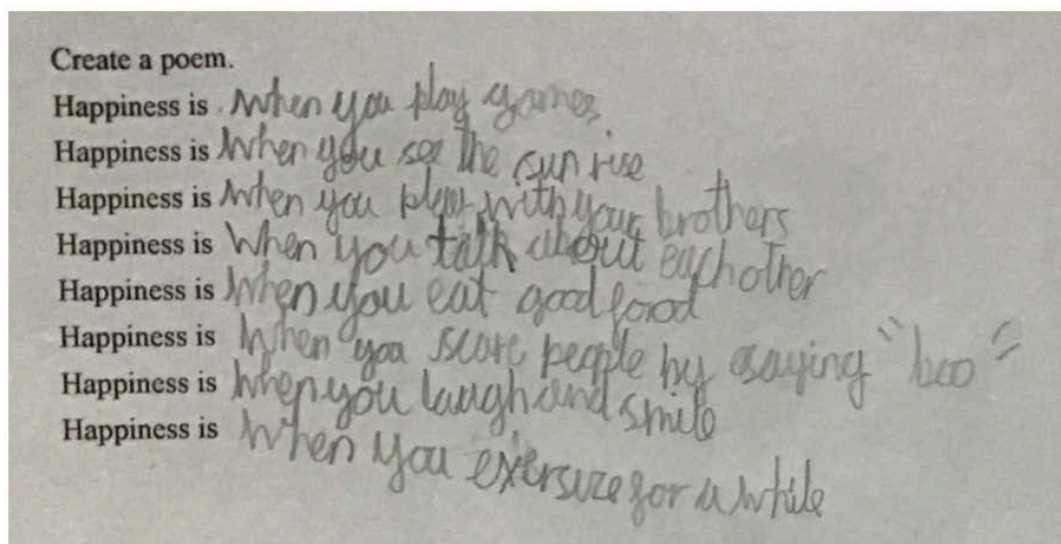
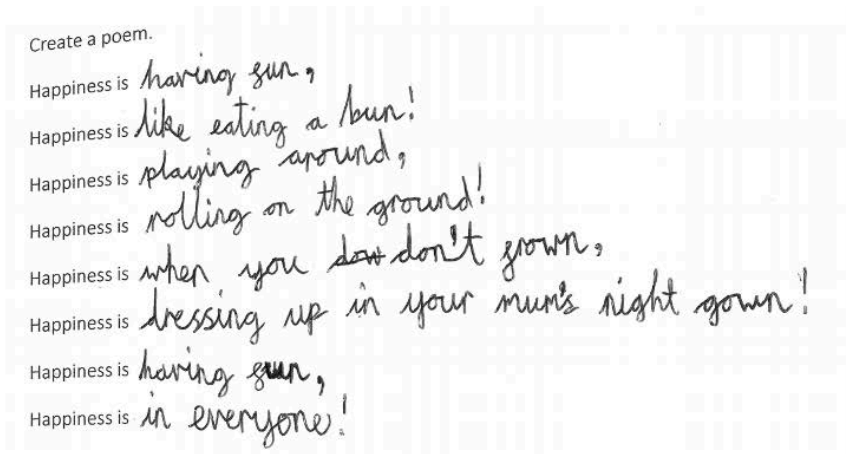

Happiness is eating healthy you do not want a sore belly!

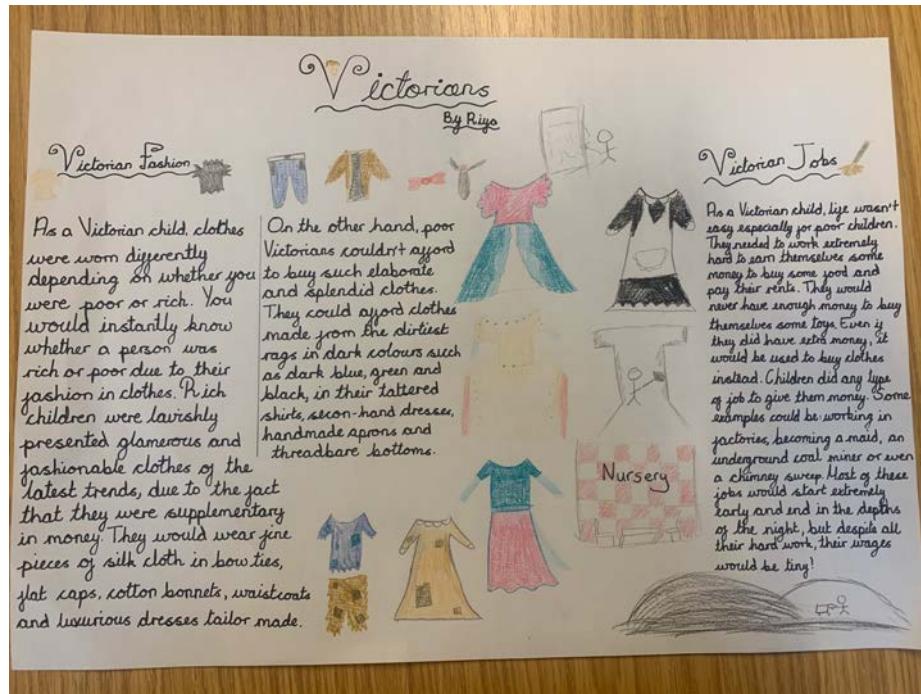
Happiness is giving somebody a gift it could simply just be giving them a lift
