NASAL FLU VACCINATION

Children from Reception to Year 6 have received a letter regarding the nasal flu vaccination. Please read this letter carefully as it contains very important information. You must complete and return the consent form that comes with the letter even if you decide that you do not wish your child to receive the vaccination. Please be reassured that your child will NOT receive this vaccination unless you have given permission.

THE START AND END OF THE SCHOOL DAY

Gates open for drop off between 8.40 am and 8.55 am for all pupils. Please try not to arrive too early as we cannot open the gate until 8.40am. Pupils should be collected promptly at the end of the day at **3.10 pm**. Please ensure your child's pick up arrangements are communicated with the school. Reception pupils are dismissed from the classroom gates Year 1 - 6 pupils line up and are dismissed from the MUGA pitch.

IDLING

A lot of cars are being parked outside the school with engines left running. While there should be no cars parked on Hendon Street, the Highway Code clearly states: "You must not leave a vehicle's engine running unnecessarily while that vehicle is stationary on a public road." ...Idling is particularly **dangerous** outside schools where young children are especially sensitive to air pollution

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

We would like to encourage 100% attendance and welcome your support with this. Children, who are not in school by 8.55 am, miss out on the essential information that class teachers give their children, as well as the settling down time each morning. We are also looking to ensure that **ALL** pupils are collected promptly at the end of the school day.

SCHOOL DINNERS

School dinners are FREE to all children in year groups Reception, 1 and 2. Please take up this opportunity. Dinners are prepared and cooked fresh each day in our own kitchen.

If your child is in Year 3 - 6, then the cost of a school dinner is £2.75 a day. All dinners must be paid for in advance. School dinners cost £13.75 a week which is £90.75 for the first half term and £187.00 for the whole term.

Please help your child learn how to use their knife and fork correctly so they are able to eat their meal independently. We encourage good table manners and ask that parents help teach these too!

PACKED LUNCH

If your child brings a packed lunch to school, please ensure it is healthy and does not include nuts, sweets, chocolate or fizzy drinks. All packed lunch bags should be well labelled. To minimise lunch bags being touched by several people, your child will keep their lunch box with them in the classroom rather than using the school fridges at first. If your child wishes to change from packed lunch to school dinners, please ensure you let the school office know. This is to ensure all children receive a meal.

SNACKS

Children in year groups Reception, 1 and 2 will be provided with a piece of fruit each day. Pupils in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 are permitted to bring in fruit for a snack at break time – **no** other food is allowed.

PARTY BAGS

We will **not** be distributing party bags or birthday cake to celebrate birthdays. If your child has a birthday and you are looking to provide the class with a treat, why not buy a book for the class - inscribed with their name!

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How Royal Greenwich residents can access benefits advice and support

Royal Greenwich Welfare Rights Service is keen to ensure that local families are claiming their full entitlements and get specialist advice if they need it. Please encourage residents to call their telephone helpline (020 8921 6375) for benefits advice or a free benefit check, particularly if they need to check if they must claim Universal Credit or if they will be better or worse off. The line is open Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 10am to 1pm. Alternatively, parents can visit the Royal Greenwich website to view benefit pages, download factsheets or use a free online benefit calculator (www.royalgreenwich.gov.uk/benefitcalculator).

Royal Greenwich also has a specialist Universal Support Team to support families who are struggling to manage Universal Credit claims. Royal Greenwich residents can contact them direct on 020 8921 3333.

As we start another academic year, a reminder that the legal age for having a WhatsApp account is 16+, therefore it is illegal for primary aged children to be using this app. It is your responsibility as parent to monitor your child's phone activity.
