THE START AND END OF THE SCHOOL DAY

The school gates open at 8.30am every day. School starts at 8.50am and all children should be in the playground by 8.45am. Children from year 1-year 5 line up in the Muga pitch at the start of the day. Pupils should be collected promptly from school at 3.15pm. Reception pupils are collected from their classroom door, Year 5 and 6 pupils are collected from the amphitheatre and pupils from year 1-4 should be collected from the Muga pitch.

YEAR 4 SCHOOL JOURNEY

Year 4 will be off on their residential on Monday 9^{th} – Friday 13^{th} March. They will be going to Rock UK which is in Northampton. Norfolk Lakes. The Year 4 staff and Mrs Amao will be accompanying the classes. Our children will be taking part in a range of activities aimed at developing teamwork, independence and confidence. We know they are going to have a great time.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

It is the intention of this Federation to offer a high - quality education for each of its pupils. For our children to gain the greatest benefit from their education it is vital that they attend school regularly and punctually. Parents of children who have any unauthorised absence and unauthorised holidays may be at risk of legal action. In order to avoid any confusion, if your child is away for legitimate reasons please ensure you follow this guidance: -

- 1. Make any dentist/doctor/hospital appointments outside of school hours.
- 2. Contact the school to discuss issues with senior members of staff rather than keep your child away.
- 3. Birthdays, holidays, relatives' visits, shopping trips, your own ill health are not reasons to keep your child away from school.

We will not authorise any holidays/ overseas trips in term time unless travel is necessary for exceptional circumstances. There is no automatic entitlement in law to time off school to go on holiday.

In order to promote attendance, each week, the class with the highest attendance will be presented a cup during Friday collective worship and also receive 10 minutes extra playtime as a reward.

If your child is absent you must:

Contact the school as soon as possible on the first day of absence, advising of the reason and likely length of absence, by telephoning the school office. (A phone call will be made to parents each time the child has been marked with an unauthorised absence code and no reason has been given for the absence). Contact the school on the subsequent days of absence as necessary. Provide evidence where possible supporting the reason for absence.



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CLASS COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

Class assemblies will take place throughout the Spring and Summer term and you are welcome to come along and find out what your children have been learning about. Your child's class teacher will let you know in advance when the assembly will be taking place.

UNIFORM

PLEASE ENSURE ALL CLOTHES ARE CLEARLY LABELLED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME. Lost property will be given to charity at the end of each term. Please can every child come to school in the correct uniform as outlined below.

PE KIT

We ask that pupils wear white t-shirts, dark coloured shorts and trainers/plimsolls for PE. As it is cold, jogging bottoms should be worn for outdoor PE. Please ensure children bring their kit, in a bag, every Monday and take it home on Friday for washing. Every pupil who is in school is expected to do PE and therefore if they forget their kit may be asked to wear some of the school's spare PE kit.

SCHOOL DINNERS

School dinners are FREE to all children in year groups R, 1 and 2. Please take up this opportunity. Dinners are prepared and cooked fresh each day in our own kitchen. For Year 3 - 5 pupils the cost of a school dinner is £2.60 a day. All dinners must be paid for in **advance**. School dinners cost £13.00 a week which is:

- 1st half term = £62.40
- 2nd half term = £65

The total for the whole term is £127.40.

PACKED LUNCH

If your child brings a packed lunch to school, please ensure it is healthy and does not include nuts, sweets, chocolate or fizzy drinks. A packed lunch could include sandwiches/wraps, pasta, beans, yoghurt, cheese, salad, vegetables or a portion of fruit. All packed lunch bags should be well labelled. Packed lunches should be placed on the lunchbox trolley in the morning and they will be stored in a **fridge** prior to lunchtime.

If your child wishes to change from packed lunch to school dinners, please ensure you let the school office know. This is to ensure all children receive a meal.

SNACKS

Children in Reception and Years 1 and 2 will be provided with a piece of fruit each day. Pupils in Year 3 - 5 are permitted to bring in fruit **only** for a snack at break time.

The school office is open every day for general enquiries during the following times 8:30 am – 9:30 am

We would politely ask that you try and avoid visiting the office outside of these times as the office staff are often very busy and may not be able to assist you.

We ask that if you are making any payment for trips, uniform or school dinners, you do so with the correct money.

Federation Chaplin's Message A Time of Blessing

Happy New Year! I hope you felt blessed over the Christmas and New Year break. This month is a time of blessing for several different reasons. New Year sees us blessing each other with best wishes for bright prospects and good opportunities to follow in the coming 12 months. Everyone hoping that the next year will be better than the last. Epiphany – the visit of the Wise Men to Jesus and the Holy Family – sees many people asking for blessings upon their homes. Some chalk the message '20+C+M+B+20' above their doors. This is a traditional blessing that reminds us of the blessings of the wise men (Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar) and how we hope to be blessed.
