In **Turner Class** they have been making angels out of paper plates. They have used their fine motor skills to cut the plate, apply the glue and decorate their angel.



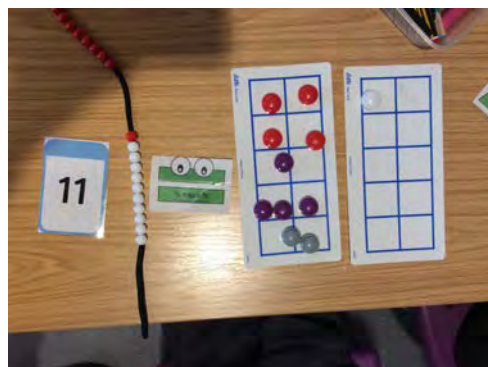
Orchard Class have been thinking about the different ways Christians prepare for Christmas. They made an Advent Calendar to help count down the days to the special event.

Ipgrave class have been learning about a variety of dishes from around the world. During DT last week, they made yoghurt parfait and pan con tomate and taste tested their delicious creations!



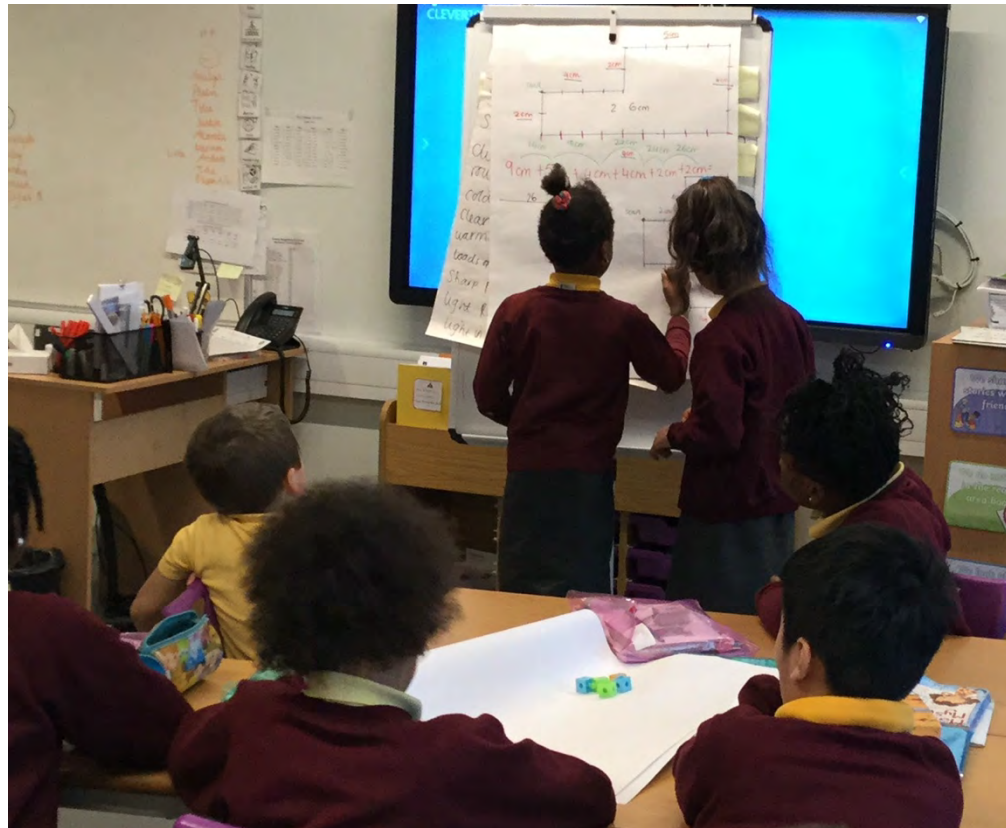
Sanders Class' Art projects combined their learning through Black History Month.

African Games - games are played by children all over the world. We have found that games are passed down orally. Ms Jones taught us a game that is very similar to one in Ebele's Favourite.

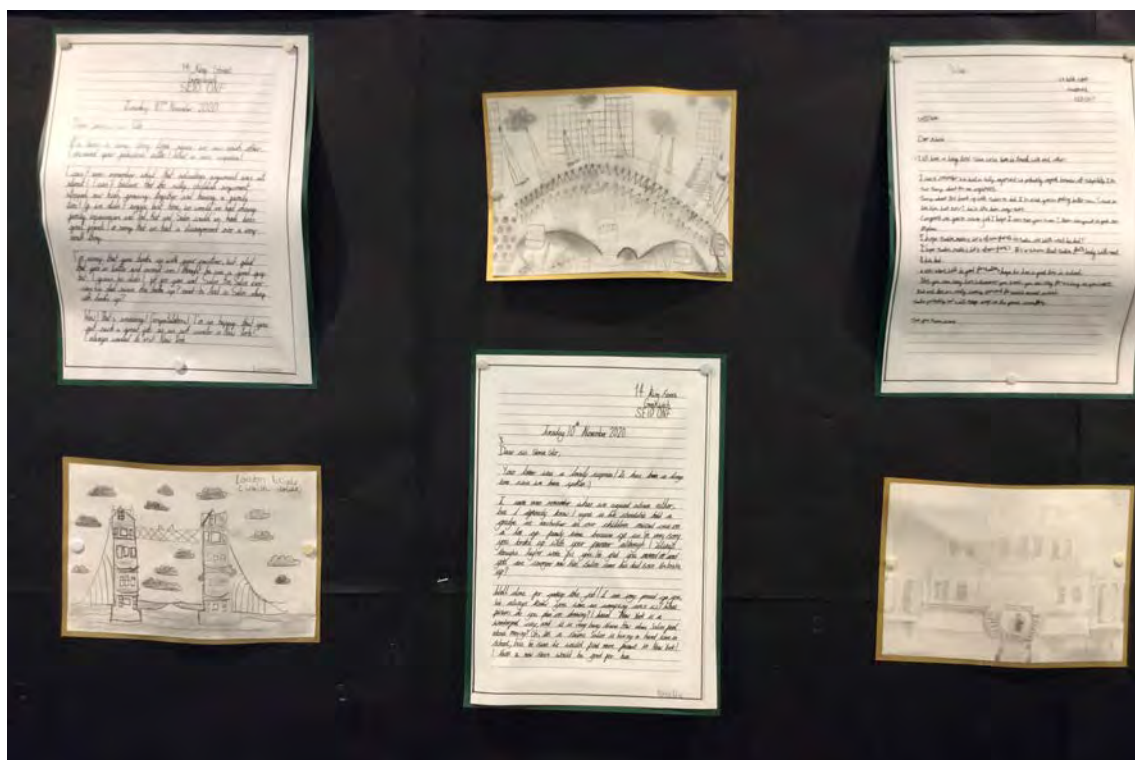
