3	A-Level, BTEC/CTEC Extended Certificate		Advanced Apprenticeship: Normally you would have studied a linked subject at A Level of GCSE.		
2	GCSEs BTEC First Certificate		Even if you have finished A Levels, you may need to drop to level 1 or 2 for an apprenticeship to learn vital skills to do the role.
