Year 7 Catch Up Premium Plan 2019/2020

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths, or both English and Mathematics at the end of key stage 2 (KS2). These pupils are deemed to be '*not* secondary ready.' This document outlines the school's proposed spend and strategy for the grant (based on the funding we received in 2018/2019), and how we believe it will close the achievement gap. The intention is to accelerate pupil progress during year 7 so that this catch up group is achieving in line with age related expectations as quickly as possible.

For 2019-2020, 48 students were identified as eligible for the Catch Up premium grant (28% of total year 7 cohort).

Guidelines:

Schools should assess the needs of the individual pupils in their school to decide the best way to use the funding. Schools should select programmes and approaches which have either been proved to be effective or are showing early promise.

Effective use of funding to support catch-up may include:

- Individual tuition in addition to classroom teaching
- Additional learning support assistants in the classroom at times
- Intensive small-group tuition
- Purchasing external services and materials to add to those provided by the school, for example tutor services or proven computer- based learning or online support
- Summer or holiday schools to deliver intensive catch-up over a short period. St mary magdalene secondary campus is committed to providing effective resources and ensuring vital support is in place for our disadvantaged students to improve their academic outcomes.

Year 7 Catch Up Premium will be used to support 21% of St Mary Magdalene Y7 cohort in English, 16% of the Y7 cohort in mathematics and 11% of the year 7 cohort in BOTH English and maths (38 pupils in English; 29 pupils in mathematics; and 19 pupils below standard, in BOTH English and mathematics).

Success Criteria:

85% of targeted Y7 pupils gain expected Year 6 in both maths and English by July 2020.
50% of targeted Y7 pupils achieve 1b (KS3 starting point), or above, by July 2020.
