We are in a difficult position where I do not wish for any of our families to incur a significant cost, particularly during this time; equally, we are not in a position where the school can incur the cost of the trips. Home Learning

Thank you all for supporting your children with their home learning over the past few weeks. We are pleased that most students are completing their work to the best of their abilities. We also hope that your child has enjoyed regularly hearing from their family group tutor over the last few weeks. Over the half-term break (Monday 25 May - Friday 29 May), students will not be set work. However, if your child has fallen behind at all, we ask they use this time to catch up on work that has not been completed. Home learning will resume on Monday 1 June.

Timetable for next year

As you know, we will welcome a new Year 7 to our school in September. This will be the first year we will have our full allocation of 900+ students on site at the same time. As such, Mr Greenwood and the SLT have been working hard on making a few changes to the school timetable which would mean that break and lunch will take place at different times for the five year groups.

Year 7 and 8 will be grouped together and Year 9, 10 and 11 will be grouped together. Break for all year groups will take place before 11am, but lunch would be later for Year 9 -11 at the time of 1.45pm. We are aware that this is later than what the students have been used to, so for this, as well as various other reasons, we propose to <u>move</u> the school day forward to begin at 8.45am and for the day to end at 3.15pm.

This would enable lunch to take place at the slightly earlier time of 1.30pm for the older year groups and mean that we finish at the same time as the primary site – meaning siblings can be picked up straight after school. This is obviously a major change and as such, I would like to obtain a greater understanding about how our students and parents feel about this.
