Dear Parent/Carers,

We have come to the end of one the most challenging periods we have all had to experience. I write to you, to thank you all for all your support with home learning for our students since lockdown began in March. I know that it has been difficult and you will have experienced more pressure than normal.

We have been working on a new plan to enable all of our students to return to school in September and will continue to do so over the summer. Please do check your emails and the school website (secondary phase) towards the end of August for further information. For now, please note the following return dates:

Wednesday 2nd September: INSET day Thursday 3rd September: INSET day Friday 4th September: Year 7 full Induction day Monday 7th September: Return for all students

Please note, the aim is for all students to experience a full learning day at school and for the timetable to be as close to a normal day as possible. We do however, have to ensure the school is a safe place for all students and staff, and as such we have put in many measures to reduce the risk of transmission and avoid any partial school closure. Our aim will be to keep whole year groups as close to a bubble as possible:

- Separate gate entrance for each year group
- Staggered dismissal time
- Staggered lunch time and separate outdoor space to be used for each year group
- All breaks to be held within classrooms
- Please provide a packed lunch for the first week (no fizzy/energy drinks) and the school will provide FSM lunches

All of the above will be provided in greater detail towards then end of August. This will be emailed to you and a text reminder will also be sent to ensure all emails have been viewed.
