Dear parents and carers,

Welcome back to all our students and staff. I hope you all enjoyed a relaxing half term break without the storms having disrupted your plans.

To start with, I would like to say huge well done to all the students who performed in Hamilton before half term. All staff and students were really impressed with the standard of the performance. I know that Mr McInnis will be providing a recorded copy for parents upon request. A huge thank you to Mr McInnis and his team.

On Moday, the Prime Minister set out the next phase of the government's COVID-19 response 'living with Covid'.

The first change to share is that the requirement for students and staff to undertake twice-weekly asymptomatic testing has been removed in most educational settings. The government have stated that education testing delivery channels will remain open so that staff and students of secondary age and above can access tests if needed to respond to local public health advice, in particular in relation to outbreaks. Staff and students are also able to access test kits from their local pharmacy or online.

## Prayer from the Chaplain

As you may have felt blown around and in a storm - May you feel the strength of God's protection in these coming days - both to start the term well but also during the beginning of Lent (starts next Wednesday). Amen.

From Thursday 24th February, the government will remove the legal requirement to self-isolate after returning a positive test. However, the advice is still to self-isolate for at least 5 days in the event of a positive test. From our school perspective, this is the expectation of all students, that if a student tests positive for COVID-19, parents will immediately inform the school and a 5 day period of self-isolation would begin. Depending on students returning a negative result on day 6 and on the type of symptoms, the school office will then discuss a return date with parents.

In addition, the government will:

- No longer ask fully vaccinated close contacts and those aged under 18 to test daily for 7 days, and remove the legal requirement for close contacts who are not fully vaccinated to self-isolate.
- End routine contact tracing. Contacts will no longer be required to self-isolate or advised to take daily tests. Staff, children and young people should attend their education settings as usual. This includes staff who have been in close contact within their household, unless they are able to work from home.

## **Covid Vaccine**

Date added for 2<sup>nd</sup> dose (or 1<sup>st</sup> for students who need)- Monday 28<sup>th</sup> February. If you would like your child to have the vaccine in school, a letter has been sent home with students, please complete the form and return it to reception as soon as possible.
