Reminder of weekly LFT testing

It is important that students continue to test on a regular basis as part of the asymptomatic testing programme. Testing means we will:

- identify and isolate those who are asymptomatic
- reduce transmission
- keep our school covid-secure

The Secretary of State for Education and the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care have written a joint letter to parents about the vaccination of children aged 12 to 15 and the importance of continuing with twiceweekly COVID-19 testing and reporting.

All of this has been extremely useful to us in directing our work in promoting equality and diversity in the school and preventing discrimination. Please see below a short summary of the findings from the recent parent/carer survey.

The overwhelming majority of parents/carers 'agreed' or 'strongly agreed' that:

- Students are treated equally at the school regardless of protected characteristic
- The history and culture of students of all backgrounds are valued and well represented
- The school has effectively promoted equality and diversity in the curriculum.
- The school challenges unconscious bias and discrimination
- The school has a strong commitment to equal treatment of students
- The school has a strong commitment to all students achieving academically

Most respondents to the survey also showed a high level of concern about racism, sexism and other forms of discrimination both in society and – to a lesser extent – in school. We share these concerns and this encourages us to continue this work.

However, we are aware that some parents and carers felt less positive about the steps we have taken, or expressed the view that not enough information had been shared, and many of you also helpfully suggested areas for improvement. We have paid close attention to your feedback, and that of staff and students. Whilst this will feed into our wider action plan, a few small examples of how we have already used this feedback are as follows:

- Creating clearer information for staff and students about how to address instances of discrimination with notices in collective worship and a poster campaign around school
- Arranging further training for staff on sexism and sexual harassment
- Passing on specific feedback to middle leaders within the school to support them in their work

Year 11 examinations in summer 2022

On 30 September, Ofqual and the DfE made a long-awaited announcement about changes to assessment at GCSE, AS and A-Level in summer 2022. This has led to exam boards clarifying arrangements and making changes in a number of subject areas; we will summarise this for you in a letter in due course. Consultations on contingency arrangements for GCSEs and for VTQs have also opened, which outline how students would be graded in case exams have to be cancelled for a third year in a row. This suggests that Year 11 students would be graded on the basis of how they perform in assessments that take place over the course of Year 11. Whatever the outcome, we can be clear that how well students work now will directly impact on the grades they achieve this summer.
