#### Year 7 sets

As of January, students will be set for English, RS, Modern Foreign Languages and Social Sciences. These sets have been decided using CAT4 tests and assessments students have sat over autumn term. Students' sets will continue to be reviewed over the course of the year. Year 7 students will be given their new timetables on Wednesday 15 December, they will appear on Satchel in early January, and students will begin their new classes on their return after the Christmas break.

#### Year 7 Mixed Ability in Maths

Following a trial in the Autumn Term, the Mathematics Department have made the decision to keep Year 7 pupils in mixed ability groupings for the time being, as we believe this is the best decision for all pupils within the year group. The mathematics teachers at SMM have been working together to plan lessons that both support pupils where they struggle with concepts, but also allow pupils to increase their depth of understanding of the same concepts, and this is something that we are passionate about continuing to do. Following the disruption of the past two years, this decision will allow us to ensure all pupils are provided with high-quality teaching of the fundamental concepts that will underpin the mathematics they study at secondary, allowing opportunity for the variety of gaps in knowledge that may have occurred between pupils to be corrected in a timely manner.
