The students had to consider their customers, unique selling points, slogan, logo & additional features such as hydrogen fuel cells and use of artificial intelligence. Groups who had worked well all day were then selected to present in front of the year group and a guest judging panel, with the winning group from 8AGZ being invited to compete at the National finals in the summer!

Y7 National Careers Challenge

On Thursday 9th February the 7s were able to take part in the national Careers Challenge, delivered by The Inspirational Learning Group. During this day students worked in groups of up to 6 to redesign an existing company using hydrogen powered vehicles rather than fossil fuels. The students developed a number of employable skills such as teamwork, communication, creativity, marketing strategy & presenting. The winning group of the day came up with a new strategy for Royal Mail to use hydrogen powered vans and lorries in order to reduce carbon emissions and improve air quality, using a comedy skit to further illustrate their idea. This group will now be moving on to the national finals in summer!



Future Frontiers – careers coaching office visits

Last term 30 Year 10 students were nominated for the Future Frontiers careers coaching programme. This programme consists of 4 trips to volunteer company offices where students are paired up with trained coached for 1-2-1 guidance sessions on linking their interests and skills with future careers. The students were split into 2 groups with half going to Zaha Hadid Architecture offices in Angel, and the others going to Argus Media offices in Holborn. This will be followed up by 2 session in Year 11 to provide further guidance with post-16 options and applications.
