Uniform

Uniform plays a crucial role in providing the students with a strong sense of identity, belonging and respect for our school community. It reinforces who we are as a community and allows students to feel proud of their school. It also helps prepare students for life after school where many will have to dress smartly for the workplace. We expect all students to be in full and correct school uniform in line with our policy.

- Full school uniform must be worn at all time, including a blazer, tie, black/gray socks, black shoes and lanyards.
- Students without the correct uniform including; black shoes or blazers, will be required to borrow school uniform from student welfare or will be sent home to collect the correct uniform.
- No hoodies tracksuit tops, trainers, or footwear such as; Uggs or Crocs are allowed to be worn in the building.
- One pair of stud earrings may be worn, no more than one per ear.
- No false eye lashes or acrylic nails to be worn
- Kits should be knee length
- No lip-gloss or other form of makeup should be worn. These will be confiscated if seen.

Wearing banned clothing items Y17-12: Given HoY Item will be confiscated and returned in school at the end of the week

Dan Snow Inspires Year 10 and Year 12 History Students

This week, we were thrilled to welcome Dan Snow, renowned historian and BBC television presenter, to our school for a fascinating and inspiring talk with our Year 10 and Year 12 history students.

Dan spoke passionately about the **importance of studying history**, explaining how it serves not just as a record of the past, but as a **vital guide to our future**. He highlighted how recognising patterns in history helps us understand where the world might be heading—and how it can help us avoid repeating past mistakes.


A major focus of his talk was the **Cold War**, during which he shared gripping, real-life stories of **individuals** whose wise and courageous actions helped prevent nuclear catastrophe. These powerful examples demonstrated the very real impact that ordinary people can have on the course of history.

Despite having no **PowerPoint or visual aids**, Dan had the entire room engaged from the very beginning. His ability to tell compelling stories, filled with insight and emotion, kept students hanging on every word. One of the most striking aspects of his presentation was his discussion on **human conflict**—how the drive to fight has marked much of our history, and why understanding that drive is essential for building a better world.

Dan emphasized that **every citizen—not just historians—needs to understand history and human behaviour** in order to be active, thoughtful members of society.

The students were so inspired by his talk that the **question-and-answer session lasted for nearly 30 minutes**, with thoughtful and curious questions pouring in. It was clear that his words sparked genuine interest and reflection among our young historians.

We're incredibly grateful to Dan Snow for sharing his time and insights—and for reminding us all why history matters.

On Wednesday 11th June, 21 of our Year 10 students participated in a powerful and thought-provoking workshop delivered by Tender, a national charity committed to preventing domestic violence through early education about healthy relationships. The session aimed to help students understand the signs of unhealthy behaviour, develop empathy, and promote respectful, positive communication.

This workshop was not only impactful in its content but also a unique opportunity for our school community, as it was partly filmed by ITV News. Kaf Okpattah, a journalist from ITV, joined the session to document it as part of a special report on a new national campaign highlighting the importance of addressing domestic violence early through school-based education.

The students—working as a mixed group—engaged in mature, meaningful discussion on what is often a challenging and sensitive topic. They handled the experience with insight, compassion and responsibility, clearly demonstrating a desire for these vital conversations to be part of wider national curriculum time in schools across the country.

In addition to filming parts of the workshop, six girls and four boys were interviewed by ITV, and you'll be able to see them representing the school during the ITV Evening News segment on Tuesday 25th June.
