# Uniform

Uniform plays a crucial role in providing the students with a strong sense of identity, belonging and respect for our school community. It reinforces who we are as a community and allows students to feel proud of their school. It also helps prepare students for life after school where many will have to dress smartly for the workplace. We expect all students to be in full and correct school uniform in line with our policy.

- Full school uniform must be worn at all time, including a blazer, tie, black/gray socks, black shoes and lanyards.
- Students without the correct uniform including; black shoes or blazers, will be required to borrow school uniform from student welfare or will be sent home to collect the correct uniform.
- No hoodies tracksuit tops, trainers, or footwear such as; Uggs or Crocs are allowed to be worn in the building.
- One pair of stud earrings may be worn, no more than one per ear.
- No false eye lashes or acrylic nails to be worn
- Kits should be knee length
- No lip-gloss or other form of makeup should be worn. These will be confiscated if seen.

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


















### Year 9 Reward Romeo and Juliet Trip

### Axiom Maths Club Visit to Bletchley Park


On Friday the 2nd of May, a group of our bright year 7 mathematicians visited Bletchley Park, to step back in time and learn about the secret work of the World War 2 codebreakers.


During their visit, pupils enjoyed a fascinating guided tour, learning about the site's pivotal role in the war effort and the extraordinary individuals who worked there - most notably Alan Turing, whose work is featured in the film

The Imitation Game and face is displayed on the £50 note. They were particularly interested in uncovering the vital role mathematics played in cracking enemy codes as we have looked at similar problems in their Axiom maths club this year.

The highlight of the day was a hands-on workshop, where students tried their own codebreaking skills, had an opportunity to use a real surviving Enigma machine from the war, and gained a deeper appreciation for the logic and problem-solving at the heart of this remarkable history.

The trip was a fantastic experience for all involved, bringing history and mathematics to life and showed the students the impact the problem-solving skills they gain in the mathematics classroom have had on the world.


