What is Children's Play, Learning and Development?

The Early Years Educator course is designed to help you develop the skills and knowledge for working in the early years sector. The range of units encourages a holistic view of child development and work experience to help develop the practical skills required for working with children. The course is taught predominantly through a work placement alongside a professional practice portfolio. This particular qualification is equivalent in size to 2 A Levels (National Diploma) or 3 A Levels (Extended Diploma).

What entry requirements will I need?

How will I be taught?

Students will be taught through a variety of teaching techniques with a combination of practical and theoretical lessons. Students will also be expected to complete a minimum of 750 hours work experience in the Early Years sector over the two years.

How will I be assessed?

A combination of written examination, coursework and tasks set by Pearson in exam conditions with time constraints.

What career opportunities does this open up?

This is a vocational qualification offering a practical and relevant start to anyone interested in a career in the Early Years Sector i.e. an Early years Educator, a nanny and a childminder.
