

A message from Dr Peter Gregory and Mrs Judith Eastaugh

We write this introduction for Christ Church C of E Primary School, part of the Koinonia Federation, with great pleasure and pride in the achievements of the school.

As a school we have one of the most well-kept Victorian buildings which is spacious and boasts a wealth of outdoor areas. We are particularly proud of our Community Garden which is maintained by the parents and friends of the school. The staff show great dedication of care, academic achievement and success which permeates across the school.

Thank you for considering joining us in this venture borne of faith. In fact, several aspects of the school have remained the same as when it was first founded in the nineteenth century – long before the law required an education to be provided. We certainly retain the Christian ethos, love and commitment to such service which have been central in the tradition at Christ Church over so many years.

As you may already know, the Governing Body is responsible for the overall running of the school. The school staff - led by both Mrs Claire Harrison and Mrs Victoria Wainwright, the Federation Executive Co-Headteachers are a lively, dedicated team, committed to developing both the well-being and education of the children here: nothing is too much trouble and parents are always able to discuss matters relating to their child with the responsible teachers and senior staff, as appropriate. School maintenance fund

As you may be aware, all Church of England schools request a Capitation Fee donation from their students. The capitation fund is voluntary for parents. However, if we cannot raise the 10% required by Governors (and parents) for the approved maintenance and capital projects, then the money would come out of the school's budget.

In the current climate of budget cuts, a school's budget is very precious and we would like to use all of the money for the education of our children and not on building and maintenance projects. This is why we appreciate you using your resources to help contribute £30.00 per child.

From September 2021 when your child is on roll you can pay your maintenance fund by using our online school payment system School Gateway. In exceptional circumstances we can except cash, but this must be sealed in an envelope with your child's name and **Capitation** clearly labelled on the front.

School Gateway


The system for school payments is called 'School Gateway'. To use the School Gateway you will need to create an account to make online payments for your child's School Meals via their smartphone app or website. You can view school meal balances and top-up at any time.

We will notify you by text or email, when new items such as school trips or capitation are available for payment on School Gateway. You will also be permitted to give online consent, where required, for your child to take part in activities or trips. This system will reduce the amount of cash being carried by students, as you can make payments 24-7.



Clothes labelling

Please label all your child's belongings clearly with their name, including their shoes, school bags and PE Kits.



School Uniform

School uniform comprises of:

| Clothing | Grey skirt or trousers or pinafore dress, dark yellow polo shirt, burgundy sweatshirt/cardigan and/or a dark grey fleece.
In the summer grey school shorts or summer dresses are allowed (red or yellow checked) |
| Footwear | Safe, flat sensible shoes or trainers – black in colour |
| Jewellery | Small studs and a wrist watch if your child can tell the time |

In the summer boys are allowed to wear grey school shorts and girls are allowed to wear red checked dresses.

Book Bags and Home School Reading

Your child is requested to bring their book bag to school every day to allow the school books to be changed once a week.

There will be a day allocated for your child's books to be changed and this information can be found in your child's reading record book.

We encourage Parents and Carers to support your child in daily reading and make short comments in their reading record books.



PE kit

Children will have 2 PE sessions a week; one indoor and one outdoor. They should bring their PE kits to school on a Monday and take them to wash on a Friday. PE kits need to be clearly labelled with the child's name on all items of kit.

They will need to get undressed and dressed independently for PE. It would help if they have practised this at home.

School Dinners/ Packed Lunch

All children in Reception are entitled to a free school meal.

Alternatively, your child may bring a healthy packed lunch – sweets, chocolate bars and fizzy drinks are not allowed.



Your child will receive a piece of fresh fruit each day - this is free of charge.

If you wish your child to have milk at school please fill in the leaflet that can be found in the Reception pack and hand it in to the school office.



Getting dressed



It is very useful if your child can dress and undress themselves when they join the school.

We do not require the majority of 4 year olds to be able to tie their own laces, but we do encourage them to try! If you want your child to have laced shoes, then they need to be able to tie them themselves. Velcro fastening shoes and slip on pumps can be less frustrating for both child and teacher in the early stages.



Lunch Times



Help is at hand to cut up food during lunchtime but we would expect all children to handle a knife and fork correctly, and sit sensibly at the table.



Going to the toilet



It can be very worrying if a child cannot manage to go to the toilet without assistance. There are often stiff fasteners, particularly on school trousers or tights which can be tricky. So a few practice sessions are worthwhile before they start school. Do reassure your child that they can always go to the toilet when needed.

During class time whether they are inside or out they can access the toilet independently. All children should know how to flush the toilet after use and wash their hands.



Extended School



We have a range of exciting and engaging extra curricular clubs that run throughout the course of each term.

The Sunset Afternoon Club runs from 3.15pm-6.00pm. This is staffed and managed by Simple Play.



School Day



We offer a 3 week transition to enable your child to get fully settled into their routine.

Your child is in full time education from
Monday 6th September.
