#### Headteacher's Message


Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

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#### **Useful Information**

#### The start and end of the school Day

Gates open for drop off between **8.40 am and 8.55 am** for all pupils. Please try not to arrive too early as we cannot open the gate until 8.40am. Pupils should be collected promptly at the end of the day at **3.10 pm**. Please ensure your child's pick-up arrangements are communicated with the school.

Reception pupils are dismissed from the classroom and Year 1 - 4 pupils line up and are dismissed from the MUGA pitch. Year 5 and 6 are dismissed from the amphitheatre.

### **Attendance and Punctuality**

We would like to encourage 100% attendance and welcome your support with this. Children who are not in school by **8.55 am**, miss out on the essential information that class teachers give their children, as well as the settling down time each morning, in preparation for a day of fun, interesting learning.

#### **SCHOOL DINNERS**

School dinners are FREE to all children in school. Please take up this opportunity. Dinners are prepared and cooked fresh each day in our own kitchen.

#### PACKED LUNCH

If your child brings a packed lunch to school, please ensure it is healthy and does not include nuts, sweets, chocolate or fizzy drinks. All packed lunch bags should be well labelled. Your child will keep their lunch box with them in the classroom rather than using the school fridges. If your child wishes to change from packed lunch to school dinners, please ensure you let the school office know. This is to ensure all children receive a meal.

#### **SNACKS**

Children in year groups Reception, 1 and 2 are provided with a piece of fruit each day. Pupils in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 are permitted to bring in fruit for a snack at break time – no other food is allowed, especially nuts, we are a **NO NUT school**.

#### **UNIFORM**

PLEASE ENSURE ALL CLOTHES ARE CLEARLY LABELLED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME. Lost property will be given to charity at the end of each term!

Please ensure that your child is wearing the correct uniform. Shoes and trainers should be black.

#### **BREAKFAST CLUB**

If your child requires a place at our breakfast club. Please telephone the office/Miss Thomas and speak to them about reserving a place.

#### WATER BOTTLES

Please ensure that your child brings a water bottle to school each day. It needs to be clearly labelled with your child's name.

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### A message from the School Chaplain, Rev Dom

This week I have been talking to staff and students about stepladders. I even dragged around some ladders for staff to look at and reflect upon.

I encouraged them to think about us all being on a stepladder in life. Some are starting on the bottom step, whilst others have got to the top and are changing the ladders that they are on.

Our Nursery and Reception children will be taking their early steps on their Primary Ladder. Our Year 7s will be stepping onto their Secondary Ladder. Our older students will be stepping into GCSEs or stepping onto Post 16 and Post 18 courses and apprenticeship ladders.
