Parents' support on educational visits is a great help to us, and having you join us in school for celebrations and other events if appreciated. Please do get in touch if you are able to support on trips and events taking place over the summer term. A gentle reminder that the deadline for giving permission for trips is 48 hours before the trip; this allows school to ensure enough adults are attending, children have enough packed lunches, and all risk assessments are up to date. Please do give permission for trips via Arbor 48 hours in advance of the class trip. If you have any issues accessing Arbor, please speak with the admin teams who can support you with this.

Our children are true advocates of change, and are active in working on how we can take care of God's world. Experiences such as the author, Mark Ballabon, who is an environmentalist, philosopher, and author of 'Home', visiting school allowed our Key Stage 2 children to think about

climate change, which is an underlying theme in his most recent book. He linked his assemblies to our Invention fair, in which children were tasked to create an invention within the theme of 'adapt and change.' We found his visit to be incredibly inspiring, especially our Eco-Warrior and Science Ambassador groups who had a specialist workshop with him. Our children gave thoughtful reflections on his visit - Zoe-Grace, Year 5: **"I like that his book was about global warming and climate change and it made me think about my invention and what I can do to make the world healthier."** Ainsley, Year 6: **"If we don't do things and find ways to change how we use resources, we won't be more efficient and non-renewable resources will be gone."** Jeremy, Year 6: **"We need to find more creative ways of using our resources because we are running out of plastic and oil and stuff. We are hurting the environment because we are wasting so much resources."**

Being part of a through school provides our primary students with opportunities to use secondary facilities such as the science labs where our Year 6 children dissected eyes. Mr Smith led the children through the process whilst also teaching them the science behind the working eye giving



Tramshed Theatre did a production called 'Sorry NOT SORRY' at the Woolwich and Peninsula campuses. They worked with the year 6 pupils giving them a safe space to think about the challenges that they face in today's society. Samuel Year 6E: I really enjoyed the "Sorry, Not Sorry" play and I encourage others to watch it because I really liked how the actors



showed us that it can be difficult to make the right choices all the time. But if we do make the right choices, we will always have a better outcome instead of it leading to violence.'

We have a very busy term ahead, and I encourage you to add our termly dates to your diaries, to your phone calendars, or stick them up in the kitchen so you know what is coming up over the weeks. In addition, please see next year's term dates. Let's continue to work together over the Summer Term to support our children to flourish and thrive.

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Useful Information and Expectations

I ask that when we are communicating, especially at times when we are unhappy, we all remember our mission and consider 'DO UNTO OTHERS, AS YOU WOULD HAVE THEM DO UNTO YOU' Luke 6:31, and treat everyone with the respect, politeness, compassion and understanding.

<u>Uniform</u>

We are continuing to look smart around the school.

If your child feels cold, please do not send them to school wearing a skin (tight clothing under a shirt) but ensure they are wearing the school jumper or cardigan. Whilst we are wearing dark-coloured bottoms and jumper, they must be regular jumpers and bottoms, not sports wear. If children are not wearing the correct PE uniform, they may be asked to wear school PE uniforms. Parents will be called to discuss this.

Children will continue to come to school on their PE lesson day in their school uniform;

- Plain white t- shirt
- dark-coloured shorts / bottoms
- dark-coloured jumper or cardigan
- black trainers/plimsolls for PE.

Children should NOT be wearing as PE uniform;

- a hoodie
- skins/ base layers under the white T-shirt
- football shirts
- sporty track suit with labels

When the children are on the campus, hoods should be down unless it is raining. This looks smarter, and we thank you again for supporting us with this.

To keep the children safe, only small studs (**no hooped earrings**) and a wrist watch is permitted. Other jewellery will be removed.

Allergies

We have multiple children and staff members with nut allergies, of which some have airborn allergies and are extremely dangerous.

Please do not send your child into school with;

- Any nuts
- Nutella or other chocolate spread containing nuts
- Peanut butter
- Snacks/ cereal bars containing nuts

Always check the ingredients of any food you are sending into school – class party food, gifts for staff, packed lunches or anything else to be certain that they do NOT contain nuts. Sometimes they are not obvious! We thank you all for your cooperation and support with keeping out school family safe.

Safeguarding and keeping our children safe are very important to us. If you have any suggestion on how we can improve on our safety measures, please do speak with Mrs Savva-Brown. If you have any concerns about any child's safety or child protection, please see the school's Designated Safeguarding Leads – Mrs Amao or Mrs Badesha ASAP.
